Teen golfer notches albatross

It's safe to say that Colin Pendlebury is probably pretty happy with his new golf clubs.

Playing his first-ever round with his set of Adams Speedline clubs, the 15-year-old Oakville Trafalgar student scored a rare albatross (double eagle) during a recent game at Oak Gables Golf Club in Ancaster.

Pendlebury needed just two shots to complete the par-5, 375-yard ninth hole at Oak Gables during a group tournament July 9. He used driver to hit his first shot 200 yards, then put the ball in the hole from 175 yards out using his hybrid four-

iron. Due to the length of the shot and the terrain, Pendlebury and his playing partners didn't realize his second shot went in the cup until after he had chipped a provisional ball onto the green and they went to remove the flag.

The ninth hole at Oak Gables is usually 424 yards from the yellow tees, but the tee blocks had been moved up to 375 yards that morning.

Pendlebury, who only plays a few rounds of golf a year, carded a 44 on the par-32 front nine of the course.

OT grad seventh at men's amateurs

Oakville's Brian Churchill-Smith turned in a top-10 finish at the Ontario men's amateur golf championship.

Churchill-Smith finished with a four-round total of 291 to finish in a tie for seventh place.

Churchill-Smith, who is coming off his freshman season with the Eastern Michigan University Eagles, opened the tournament with a round of two-under 69 at the Brampton Golf Club. The round included four birdies.

He followed that with rounds of 73 and 72 before finishing with a 77.

Mark Hoffman of the Thornhill Golf and

Country Club led wire-to-wire, taking the title by six strokes with a four-day total of 275. Another six strokes separated second-place finisher Ryan Terdik of Brantford from the rest of the field. He was three-under for the tournament.

Churchill-Smith was named the Michigan Athletic Conference co-freshman of the year as well as second team All-MAC honours. Churchill-Smith posted a scoring average of 74.3 over 30 rounds at EMU.

The Oakville Trafalgar grad had three top-10 finishes, including a 10th-place showing at the MAC championships where he scored a four-round total of 299.

OAK competes at Man/Sask event

A team of 10 Oakville Aquatic Club (OAK) swimmers finished seventh overall at the recent Man/Sask Long Course Championships.

Seven OAK swimmers won at least one medal each at the meet, led by Scott Love's four-medal showing (one silver, three bronze). Blaze Slavkovski

notched OAK's lone gold at the meet, winning the 13-year-old boys' 50-meter backstroke, while Brody Dyson, Collyn Gagne, Emilie Gagne, Anthony Ivakhnenko and Hailey Norris also contributed podium fin-
