Crown will appeal judge's Shell Park decision After reviewing a recent decision to toss out videotaped evidence in last year's Shell Park scandal, the Halton Crown Attorney's Office has launched

an appeal of the ruling. Earlier this month Provincial Court Judge Douglas Latimer determined the use of a video camera to monitor homosexual activity in the men's washroom at Shell Park was an invasion of privacy and had infringed Section 8 of the Charter of Rights and Freedoms.

Judge Latimer threw out the videotaped evidence against five of those charged and stayed the charges against them. They were among a total of 46 men arrested during the July 1993 operation which took place just days before the law changed requiring a judge's authorization to conduct such video surveillance.

Halton Crown Attorney Brian O'Mara said litigation is necessary to determine whether the operation constituted an unreasonable search - an issue which should be defined by an appellate court.

O'Mara would also like to see clarified the issue of whether police must consider imminent alterations in the law before determining how to proceed with their investigations. A total of 61 sex acts were cap-

tured on tape. In only one instance did a man wear a condom. A 53 year old man whom investigators said had AIDS killed himself a short while after his arrest by leaping off a bridge.

In previous investigations regarding anonymous sex acts in public places in town police had difficulties obtaining convictions. When the problem re-surfaced at Shell Park and police set up their surveillance - this members of the public complained, time armed with video equipment.

the Five Drive-in on Ninth Line. Police have issued descriptions of each of the suspects:

Suspect One - 5' 10", 160 lbs, wearing a dark hooded pullover, blue jeans, grey hat and white mask.

Suspect Two - 6', 160 lbs, wearing a red hooded pullover, dark colored pants, dark footwear, a white mask and armed with a

six-inch knife.

Suspect Three - 5' 8", 160 lbs, wearing a dark sweatshirt, dark pants, white runners, a black balaclava and armed with a semiautomatic handgun.

Suspect Four - 5' 10", 190-200 lbs, wearing a light colored jacket or sweatshirt, dark pants, white runners and carrying a straight edged weapon believed to be a machete.

Investigators are comparing this latest crime with last year's robbery at Aikenhead's which occurred at 7:30 a.m. on Christmas Eve morning.

In this instance, four armed men described as non-whites three brandishing handguns, a fourth carrying a machete barged into the store and ordered approximately 24 employees and customers to lie on the floor. After taking money from the cash office they fled in a silver minivan. The faces of all the suspects were covered with hoods and scarves.

Vandalism has no bounds, apparently, after a nest filled with baby birds vanished from outside a loca business over the weekend.




