

Local striker nets golden goal to clinch crown

When Ryan Gamble joined the Oakville Blue Devils, he simply wanted to be part of the Canadian Professional Soccer Club's inaugural season and help bring the team's young players along.

He certainly ended up contributing a lot more than that.

Gamble scored in extra time of Monday's CPSL final at Esther Shiner Stadium in North York, lifting the Blue Devils to a 2-1 win over the Vaughan Shooters and giving the first-year squad the league championship.

"Oakville is such a soccer community and... it makes it even more special that I live in Oakville and could help the team by scoring a very important goal," said the 32-year-old Gamble, who immigrated to Oakville from South Africa when he was eight years old. "I've had a few (golden goals) but it was probably the biggest golden goal I've ever scored."

Gabriel Pop, the league's second-leading goal scorer this season, set up the play with a pass just outside the 18-yard-box. Gamble blasted a shot past Shooters keeper Brian Bowes and into the top-left corner of the net.

"I think it was very fitting for Ryan. He's been a model professional and an inspiration to our younger players," Blue Devils coach Duncan Wilde said. "You couldn't write the script any better for a local boy who came in once we had the squad in place and said 'If you'll have me, I'd like to be part of this and maybe I can help you.' It was a great moment for him."

Making the goal even more special for Gamble,

"It's bitter-sweet but there's nothing better than going out by scoring a golden goal to win a championship for your hometown," Gamble said.

by the league.


