## High-point awards for Dolphins swimmers at Mega Meet

Jacque Baillie and Conor Russell each won high-point awards in their respective divisions, leading the Dolphins Swim Club to a satisfying completion to its season at the North York Youth Cup and Mega Meet earlier this month.

With relatively-small representation at the Mega Meet, the Dolphins still managed to finish third overall in team standings. Baillie won the high-points award in the girls' 11-12 division, with Russell taking similar honours in the boys' 10-and-under division. Ola Michalec placed third overall in points in girls' 13-14 competition.

Gold-medal performances came from Russell (50-metre, 100m and 200m freestyle, 200m individual medley), Baillie (200m and 400m freestyle, 50m butterfly) and Michalec (50m butterfly).

Among the Dolphins' silver-medal winners were Olivia Sbaraglia (10-and-under girls' 50m freestyle), Sara Pearson (14-year-old girls' 100m freestyle), Russell (100m butterfly), Baillie (100m freestyle, 100m and 400m individual medley) and Michalec (100m and 200m butterfly).

Sbaraglia added bronze in the 100m

backstroke.

Adding top-10 finishes were Michelle Gervais, Joel Pearson, Linda Wang and Olivia Andersen.

In relay, the girls' 11-12 team won gold in the 200m medley and freestyle events. The girls' 13-14 team added silver in the 200m freestyle and bronze in the 200m medley.

The Dolphins set 28 club records at the Mega Meet, which featured 16 teams.

### Youth Cup

In the Youth Cup, held the same day at the Etobicoke Olympium, Sinead Russell felt ill but was still able to win two golds, two silvers and two bronzes in girls' 13-14 competition.

The 13-year-old won the 50m backstroke and 50m freestyle, placed second in the 100m and 200m backstroke, and came third in the 100m freestyle and 400m individual

Other highlights at the event included 11-year-old Lauren Dixon's 200m breast-stroke swim, which ranked her first in Canada in her age group, and 12-year-old Bronwyn Evans' 800m freestyle swim, which qualified her for the Canadian National Age Group Championships.
